Marple rips Royals

UPPER DARBY - One of Upper Darby High's football fans found a curious way to express his wishes Saturday.

His sign, hanging over the front rail of the Royals' stands, said simply: "Miracles can happen."

Actually, the sentiments weren't out of place. The Royals were playing undefeated Central League rival Marple Newtown, one of the top rated teams in the area. As it turned out, they could have filled the water buckets with holy water, stuffed rosaries in their pockets and hung rabbits feet around their necks and still come up short.

Marple Newtown, after a sluggish start, steamrolled to a 34-6 victory over the outmanned Royals.

The Tigers needed their defense to get them uncranked as the underdog Royals kept the visitors bottled up for a good portion of the first half.

On the Royals' first series of the game, Joe Grande fumbled and Gil Maze of the Tigers scooped up the ball and rambled 31 yards for a touchdown.

Later in the first period, Upper Darby quarterback Scott Hadfield was jolted while attempting to pass.

Marple Newtown's Craig Wolf plucked the ball out of the air and returned it to the Royals' 15.

With first and goal from the 2, Upper Darby hung tough for three plays until Tiger quarterback Jock Peterson banged over from the 1.

Midway through the second quarter, the Marple Newtown offense finally got together and drove from its 39 for a score.

Tim Lambert capped the 12 play drive with a seven yard run.

Marple's slow starting offense came as no surprise to coach Bob Kenig.

"I expected some letdown after the four games we had played (wins over Lower Merion, Ridley, Norristown and St. Mark's)," he said.

"Jock got us going with his passing." Peterson picked the Upper Darby defense for 99 yards, hitting eight of his 14 passes.

His backup, Bill Turner, who "could start for any team in the county," according to Kenig, chipped in with 34 yards passing.

On the series after their scoring drive, the Tigers struck again as Peterson found Wolf a step ahead of a Royal defender. The pass was for a 38-yard score.

Early in the third quarter it was the Royals' turn in the spotlight as Tony D'Andrea blocked Tim Moore's punt. Dan Henry grabbed the ball and took it in for six points.

The Royals' defense actually held the Tigers' first team offense scoreless in the second half.

Peterson had moved the Tigers deep into Royals' territory late in the third quarter, but the Royals' Brian Smith intercepted a pass to end the threat.

The interception was one of two Marple Newtown turnovers. Upper Darby lost the ball four times.

Midway through the final stanza, Turner came on and directed the Tigers to their final score.

Aided by a 34-yard pass from Turner to Bob McLaughlin, the visitors marched down to the 2. From there, Kurt Worley carried it in for six points.

Henry's touchdown proved to be the only threat the Royals could muster for the rest of the game.

Upper Darby netted minus four yards in the second half for a game total of 33 yards.

The Tigers piled up 266 yards in an almost perfectly balanced game. The visitors had 134 yards of offense in the first half and 132 in the second half.

Joe Wenner was Marple's leading rusher with 51 yards on 13 carries.

Apparently, one of the Royals' fans is going to bring out his message again and hope for better results.
